Foreword from the Chief Executive

Greetings to you all,

I joined the Life Flight team in March. I've come into an organisation that's in really good shape, courtesy of the fantastic leadership of my predecessor, Ian Pirie, and the great team that's in place here in Wellington.

In October 2018 we were part of a successful group bid to continue supplying helicopter rescue services locally across Central New Zealand. Our Westpac Rescue Helicopter continues to cover the Lower North Island and Upper South Island, as part of our partnership with the seven other rescue bases in the Central Air Ambulance Rescue Limited (CAARL) consortium.

My first week ended with our 2019 Open Day. More than 4,000 people attended on a very cold and windy Sunday here at our base. For me, just starting in a new role, it highlighted that teamwork remains at the heart of everything we do.

Our pilots, crew and support teams continue to work closely with Specialist Doctors and Nurses from Wellington Hospital, and Flight Paramedics from Wellington Free Ambulance on every mission.

Safety remains paramount across every aspect of our aeromedical services. We're continually reviewing our day-to-day operations to ensure our aircraft, and all the specialist equipment that they carry, are always ready for whatever challenges our crew might face on their next flight.

And, as I've discovered, keeping two air ambulance planes and a rescue helicopter ready to fly 24/7 takes a lot of time, effort and money. We're very fortunate to continue to enjoy amazing support from a growing number of corporate and community partners, and individual donors, which ultimately helps us to save time and save lives.


So, on behalf of the entire team, I want to say a huge thank you to everyone who's contributed to Life Flight for your continuing support.



Wellington Regional Hospital is the tertiary referral centre for the lower North Island and upper South Island.

The Hospital's Intensive Care Unit supports nine public hospitals: Wairau, Nelson, Masterton, Whanganui, Hawkes Bay, Palmerston North, Hutt and Taranaki.

Wellington Hospital is responsible for intensive care patients in those regions who cannot access the care they require locally.

To manage such a large area, the hospital uses Life Flight to perform the necessary emergency air transfers via plane or helicopter.

Elsa's flight for life

Your support provided hope when Sarah and Mike received the shocking news. Their gorgeous five-month-old daughter Elsa had a diaphragmatic hernia.

Little Elsa fell very ill. She was rushed to Nelson Hospital for x-rays. Doctors identified the very rare birth defect. It caused her bowel to loop into her chest, filling her stomach with air and making her very sick.

There had not been another case like it for six years in New Zealand.

Fortunately, the Paediatric team that operated on the previous case was still at Christchurch Hospital. Thanks to your generosity, Elsa could be flown in our Air Ambulance Plane that night, in time for life-saving surgery.

Her whole family was even able to be flown with her, which was comforting during such a distressing time.

The experienced medical team at Christchurch Hospital performed the challenging surgery successfully. Elsa is now very happy to be home and on the road to recovery.

“We just cannot thank you enough for being there. Without this service, Elsa wouldn't be here,” says Sarah.

Thanks to your support, Elsa was urgently flown to life-saving surgery and she is now a healthy little girl.

Joe's bush rescue

“My wife, Suzanne, and I offer you our most heartfelt thanks.” - Joe

Joe and his friend Dave were in the Aorangi Forest Park. After a long day out in the bush, Joe was heading down a steep hill when the ground gave way and sent him sliding down a cliff face.

He fell six metres, badly injuring his leg in the process.

“On the way down my boot got caught in some bedrock sticking out from the side. It cranked my foot at right angles, ripped all the ligaments off my ankle and broke one of the bones below the knee.”

In addition to a broken leg, it was also getting dark and cold. Joe would not be able to walk out on his own in his condition and hypothermia was a very real threat.

Fortunately, Joe was carrying a personal locator beacon with him. His emergency signal was sent.

The Life Flight team soon received the call. Within minutes our Westpac Chopper team was on its way.

Arriving at the scene, our team immediately knew it wasn't going to be an easy rescue. It was pitch black and very windy, and Joe was stuck in a steep valley.

Crewman Mike says, “Darkness was one of the big challenges. We do operate in the dark but there are varying degrees; it ended up being a particularly dark night”.

It was challenging, but because of the team's incredible training – made possible thanks to your amazing support – Joe was safely and swiftly rescued.

Financials

Fees that we are able to charge government agencies for services make up approximately 50% of the funds required to keep our service operational.

This means there is a significant annual funding shortfall, which our wonderful supporters donate toward.
